

**MEETING OPENED**

There being a quorum, the County Chairman called the meeting of the Orange County Board of County Commissioners to order at 6:10 p.m. in Commission Chambers on the First Floor, Orange County Administration Center, on Thursday, September 12, 2002. The following were present:

Commissioners Teresa Jacobs and Homer Hartage were absent.

The County Administrator announced that the purpose of the public hearing is to consider and adopt tentative millages and budgets for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2002, and ending September 30, 2003.

The County Administrator reviewed the order of the public hearings and announced that the final County budget public hearing will be held on September 26, 2002, at 6 p.m., and the final Library budget public hearing will be held on Thursday September 24, 2002, at 5:01 p.m.

**PUBLIC HEARING-MANDATORY REFUSE COLLECTION SPECIAL ASSESSMENT**

Notice was given that the Board of County Commissioners would hold a public hearing to consider the following proposed resolution:

RESOLUTION OF THE ORANGE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ESTABLISHING THE CALENDAR YEAR 2002 SPECIAL ASSESSMENT AT \$146.06, FOR FULL SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SERVICE PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 32 OF THE ORANGE COUNTY CODE.

Staff reviewed the proposed resolution and outlined its provisions. Staff presented a report regarding the requests for exemptions to the Mandatory Refuse Collection Program and the staff and hearing officer recommendations.

No one appeared regarding the staff and hearing officer recommendations.

**Upon a motion by Commissioner Hoenstine, seconded by Commissioner Johnson, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote; Commissioners Jacobs and Hartage were absent; the Board accepted the staff and hearing officer recommendations for exemptions to the Mandatory Refuse Collection Program.**

**Upon a motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Hoenstine, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote; Commissioners Jacobs and Hartage were absent; the Board adopted Resolution 2002-M-34 setting the mandatory refuse special assessment rate at \$146.06 for fiscal year 2002-03.**

**PUBLIC HEARING-NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENT ROLL AND RESOLUTION FOR LAKE SHERWOOD HILLS AND RIO PINAR WOODS**

Notice was given that the Board of County Commissioners would hold a public hearing to consider the adoption of the non-ad valorem assessment roll authorizing the tax collector to use the uniform method of collection of non-ad valorem assessments levied by the Orange County Board of County Commissioners as provided in Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes and

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA, APPROVING ASSESSMENT ROLLS FOR THE LAKE SHERWOOD HILLS WEST MUNICIPAL SERVICE BENEFIT UNIT AND THE RIO PINAR WOODS MUNICIPAL SERVICE BENEFIT UNIT; ESTABLISHING THE LIEN ASSOCIATES THEREWITH; DIRECTING THAT THE ASSESSMENT ROLLS BE CERTIFIED TO THE ORANGE COUNTY TAX COLLECTOR; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Staff presented a report and announced that this public hearing includes the adoption of the non ad-valorem assessment roll authorizing the Tax Collector to utilize the uniform method of collection of non ad-valorem assessments levied by the Board of County Commissioners.

No one addressed the Board regarding the non-ad valorem assessment roll or the Lake Sherwood Hills/Rio Pinar Woods Resolution.

The County Chairman closed the public hearing and opened the matter for Board discussion.

**Upon a motion by Commissioner Hoenstine, seconded by Commissioner Johnson, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote; Commissioners Jacobs and Hartage were absent; the Board accepted and adopted the non-ad valorem assessment roll as presented, with the unit of measurement and the respective amounts by subdivision and/or parcel identification number as stated in the assessment roll; and further, adopted Resolution 2002-M-35 establishing the Lake Sherwood Hills and the Rio Pinar Woods assessment roll.**

**PUBLIC HEARING-ALL OTHER MILLAGES AND FUNDS**

The County Administrator announced that the fiscal year 2002-2003 budget is the second year of a 2-year budget cycle and reflects all necessary adjustments to the originally approved budget.

Staff announced the proposed countywide millage rate and outlined the countywide tax millage information for all taxing units under the Board of County Commissioners and the aggregate millage rate.

The County Chairman closed the public hearing and opened the matter for Board discussion.

**Upon a motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Hoenstine, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote; Commissioners Jacobs and Hartage were absent; the Board adopted Resolution 2002-M-36 setting the tentative countywide millage rate.**

Staff announced the budget information.

**Upon a motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Hoenstine, and carried with all present members voting AYE by voice vote; Commissioners Jacobs and Hartage were absent; the Board adopted Resolution 2002-M-37 adopting the tentative County budget.**

The County Chairman recognized Property Appraiser Bill Donegan and Supervisor of Elections Bill Cowles.
