

RESOLUTION NO. 86-M-42

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AN EXPERIMENTAL  
TRUCK LANE RESTRICTION ON INTERSTATE 4  
IN ORANGE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, requiring trucks with three or more axles to use the middle lane of Interstate 4, and limiting their speed to 45 mph through the metropolitan area of Orange County will make Interstate 4 a more efficient and safer road; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of this experimental truck lane restriction and speed limit on Interstate 4 in Orange County is in the best interest of the citizens of Orange County;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Orange County, Florida:

1. That the Florida Department of Transportation is urged to investigate the feasibility of adopting an experimental truck lane restriction and speed limit on Interstate 4 in Orange County and refer the results of this investigation to the Metropolitan Planning Agency.

2. That such restrictions shall apply on Interstate 4 the full distance between Orange Blossom Trail (U. S. Highway 441) and Maitland Boulevard (State Road 426-A), and require that trucks with three or more axles use the middle lane of Interstate 4, except for ingress and egress, and that the speed of said trucks be limited to 45 mph.
