A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE TOWN OF
EATONVILLE'S EFFORT TO OBTAIN HISTORICAL
DESIGNATION

WHEREAS, the Town of Eatonville is a unique and historic city by virtue of being the nation's oldest incorporated black township; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Eatonville is eligible for designation on the National Register of Historic Places; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Eatonville is in the process of applying to the State of Florida for assistance pursuant to Chapter 267, as an historic property to preserve its historic heritage.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Orange County supports wholeheartedly the efforts of the Town of Eatonville to obtain historic designation both at the State and Federal levels and directs its staff to designate the Town of Eatonville or appropriate sections as historic properties in Orange County's comprehensive plan once the Town of Eatonville obtains designation as an historic property.
