

RESOLUTION NO. 88-M-93

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A MAXIMUM SPEED  
LIMIT OF 25 MILES PER HOUR FOR THE RESI-  
DENTIAL DISTRICT KNOWN AS Wekiva; Wekiva, Section 2;  
Wekiva, Section 3; Wekiva, Section 4; Wekiva, Section 5.

WHEREAS, Section 316.189 and Section 316.183, Florida  
Statutes, as amended by Chapter 88-47, Laws of Florida,  
authorizes a county to set a maximum speed limit of 25 miles  
per hour for a residential district after an investigation  
determines that such a limit is reasonable; and

WHEREAS, Orange County has determined after an investi-  
gation that the maximum speed limit should be 25 miles per  
hour for the residential district known as Wekiva; Wekiva, Section  
2; Wekiva, Section 3; Wekiva, Section 4; Wekiva, Section 5.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COM-  
MISSION OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

1. The maximum speed limit shall be 25 miles per hour  
for all streets located within the residential district known  
as Wekiva; Wekiva, Section 2; Wekiva, Section 3; Wekiva, Section 4;  
Wekiva, Section 5.

2. This Resolution shall become effective upon the  
date of its adoption.

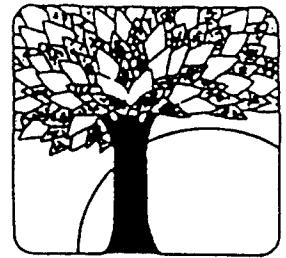

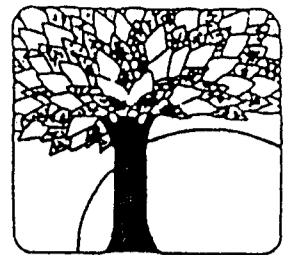

Dear Gentlemen,

The Wekiva Hunt Club Community Association requests that you lower the speed limit on Canterclub Trail from Piedmont Wekiva Road in Orange County to West Wekiva Trail in Seminole County from the current 30 m.p.h. to 25 m.p.h. Canterclub Trail east of West Wekiva Trail is already 25 m.p.h. In fact, the Seminole County portion of Canterclub Trail was 25 m.p.h. up until three years ago when Seminole County engineers decided that speed limits for Canterclub in both counties needed to be consistent. Since Orange County would not lower the speed limit, Seminole County had to raise the speed limit to 30 m.p.h. Now that Orange County has decided to lower subdivision speed limits to 25 m.p.h. (see attached article) the Orange County portion should be lowered to 25 m.p.h. to ensure consistency, we would expect that Orange and Seminole Counties will coordinate the installation of the signs so that they will be changed the same day.

Currently, Canterclub Trail is used as a shortcut to avoid the delays and condition of Piedmont Wekiva Road. With over 100 children living on Canterclub Trail, we need to reinforce the residential nature of the street. The WHCCA has already installed a landscaped median island and lined the street with trees to aid in that effort.

The 25 m.p.h. speed limit will complement this. It will also enable the Sheriff's department to more easily identify and cite speeders. This stricter enforcement will help to minimize Canterclub being used as a shortcut and will help maintain the residential nature of the street.

We appreciate your earliest consideration to this matter.
