RESOLUTION NO. 94-M-34

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY FLORIDA NOMINATING SOUTH APOPKA AS AN URBAN ENTERPRISE COMMUNITY AND AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION TO U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has announced a major new program to rebuild economically and socially depressed urban areas herein referred to as the Urban Empowerment Zone and Enterprise Community Program; and

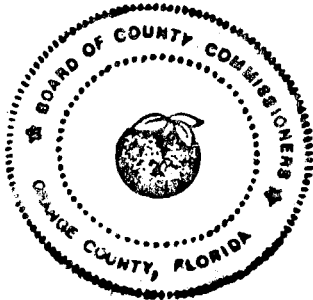
WHEREAS, this program requires that a minimum of 20% of residents in a nominated census tract earn below the federal poverty level; and that the nominated area not exceed 20 square miles; and that residents have engaged in a meaningful community driven "bottom up" needs assessment and planning process; and

WHEREAS, the South Apopka Project, now celebrating its third anniversary, has become a national model for community empowerment and qualifies for the Urban Enterprise Community Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

That Orange County expresses its support for the nomination of the South Apopka area and census tract 176, as a designated Urban Enterprise Community, and pledges its continued support toward the revitalization of the community.
