RESOLUTION NO. 95-M-101

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A BOAT SPEED LIMIT
ON LAKES ISLEWORTH, LOUISE, WAUNATTA AND
CARLTON; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR
SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Orange County Board of County Commissioners is authorized by ordinance and state statute to establish boat speed limits applicable to waterways located in all portions of Orange County including those waterways located within incorporated areas in Orange County not governed by a city ordinance in the same subject matter; and

WHEREAS, the Orange County Board of County Commissioners, hereby determines that a speed limit on any portion of lakes Isleworth, Louise, Waunatta and Carlton located within Orange County (including incorporated areas) is necessary in order to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Orange County;

WHEREAS, said speed limit shall not apply to any connecting canals; or areas within one hundred (100) feet of shoreline, docks, piers or boathouses, where a lower speed limit or no wake zone is required; and

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. THAT, a speed limit of 40 mph is established on the open waterways within Orange County (including those

portions of Orange County within the boundaries of any municipality) of lakes Isleworth, Louise, Waunatta and Carlton during daylight hours. Daylight hours shall be the time period between sunrise and sunset.

Section 2. THAT, a speed limit of 20 mph is established on the open waterways within Orange County (including those portions of Orange County within the boundaries of a municipality) of lakes Isleworth, Louise, Waunatta and Carlton at all other times.

Section 3. THAT, a copy of this Resolution is being furnished to the Sheriff and State Attorney of Orange County.

Section 4. PENALTY. Violators of this Resolution shall be subject to penalties for careless operation of a boat, motorboat, or vessel, in the manner provided by general law.

Section 5. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are declared severable.

Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
