

Ethics for appointing Lobbyist to Citizen Boards and Commissions: Prohibition
Suggest area for Charter location: New Section and Paragraph 707 G. and 707 G.
1.

707 G. Prohibition against appointments for registered lobbyists for non-elected positions including but not limited to: Committees, Boards and Commissions. This is for lobbyist that might have potentially areas of their private employment which conflict for the proposed appointment. If the applicant feels this isn't correct, they can appeal to an ethics board to rule. This will not apply to any position restricted by a Florida Statute.

707 G. 1. Prohibition of 2 years after a citizen serving on Non-elected Committee, Board and Commission positions becoming a paid lobbyist within area of public service.

- This avoids the issue of the appearance of influencing decisions while serving the citizens.

Note: This rule will be in effect once enacted by voters for new appointments, Previous appoints to this rule going into effect are allow to finished out there terms.
