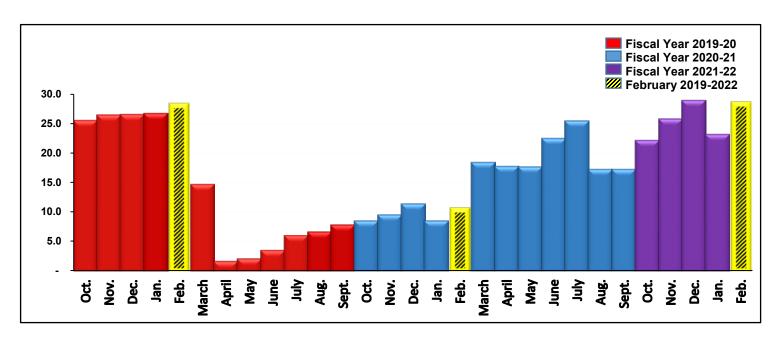
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## TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX COLLECTIONS ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA

ORLANDO, FLORIDA – Orange County Comptroller Phil Diamond announced today that Tourist Development Tax (TDT) collections received by Orange County for the February 2022 TDT collection month were \$28,362,000. That is a 173.9% increase over February 2021.

Month-over-month, February collections were higher than January collections by \$5.9 million and were higher than February 2020 collections by \$255,800. These were the highest February collections ever and the third highest monthly collections ever. The chart below shows monthly TDT collections for the current fiscal year and the previous two fiscal years.

Overall, this was another strong month for TDT collections. Metro Orlando's occupancy rate for February averaged 73.7%, the second highest level since the start of the pandemic, and the average daily rate (ADR) was \$155, Orlando's highest ADR on record (Source: Visit Orlando). On the TDT reserve side, there was a \$5.9 million increase in the Renewal and Replacement Reserve in February as shown in the attached "TDT Cash Reserve Summary". On a cumulative basis, since the start of the pandemic, the County has used \$123.6 million of reserves to meet its TDT obligations. That has caused our undesignated "Other Authorized Uses" reserves to decrease from \$181.3 million to \$57.7 million during that time.

We will release the March TDT collections report in early May.

- 1. Debt service reserves are restricted for debt service only and equal the maximum annual debt service payment.
- 2. The County has committed to maintaining a reserve for property replacement equal to 4% of the Convention Center's gross physical plant and equipment-excluding construction in progress. This Renewal and Replacement Reserve component is currently fully funded at \$63,172,785.
